



## GUIDE LINES FOR POSTER PRESENTATION

- Age must be less than 35 years.
- Should send scanned 10<sup>th</sup> marks card along with conference registration.
- Poster must be on sub themes of the conference
- Must be an original research article and not published anywhere else earlier.
- **Time** : 8 minutes presentation, 2 minutes discussion
- Poster presenters must be present at their poster during the tea and lunch break.

### Instructions to poster design

An academic poster is a graphic and textual method of presenting information. Following guidelines have to be followed to prepare posters.

1. The abstract & introduction should be brief, informative and should be less than 100 words each
2. Study area must include map with less than 5 line of descriptive
3. Methodology will be written in less than 50 words.
4. Findings are the most important part of the poster which includes 1 or 2 map, diagram, or table with less than 200 words.
5. Give only less than 5 references at the end.
6. Make font size at least:  
**80 – 96** point for titles,  
**30 – 36** point for headings  
**18 – 24** point for text
7. Text should be in **Helvetica** or **Arial** font which is usually the clearest.
8. Use the following given template (Microsoft publisher) to prepare poster presentation

- **Dead line for poster submission :** 09<sup>th</sup> October 2017
- Full paper should reach us before 28<sup>th</sup> October 2017
